JOB SUMMARY

Serves as an advanced-level healthcare provider within the community, bridging the gap between emergency medical services, primary care, and social support systems. This position focuses on proactive, preventative, and follow-up care for patients who frequently utilize emergency services, are at risk for hospital readmission, or face barriers to traditional healthcare access.

The Mobile Integrated Health Technician (MIHT) provides in-home assessments, chronic disease management support, health education, referrals to appropriate resources, collaborates with local healthcare providers, hospitals, and community agencies to improve patient outcomes and reduce unnecessary emergency calls, and other duties as required.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Capable of performing all primary job responsibilities within their scope and, in compliance with local protocols;
- Examines, screens, treats, and coordinates health services for patients upon referral from Western Lane Fire and EMS Authority or Peace Harbor Medical Center;
- Conducts post-hospital release follow-up care including, but not limited to, monitoring medication, dressing changes, checking vital signs, and drawing blood;
- Documenting findings and reporting to providers when necessary;
- Conducting patient education including discharge summaries, disease prevention and treatment, falls assessment, geriatric comorbidities, and nutrition;
- Administer patient care consistent with WLFEA protocols, scope of practice, and provider orders;
- Cleaning and maintenance of MIHT vehicle, equipment and station;
- Operating on an ambulance during periods of high call volume as a medical provider;
- Performs other related duties as assigned.

REQUIRED EDUCATION, DEGREES, CERTIFICATES, AND/OR LICENSES

- Minimum of Oregon State License of Emergency Medical Technician
- Certification in Basic Life Support or equivalent
- ICS 100, 200, 700, 800 (or completion within 6 months)
- Possess a valid Oregon Driver's license with good driving history
- Strong interpersonal, communication, and problem-solving skills

PREFERRED EDUCATION, DEGREES, CERTIFICATES, AND/OR LICENSES

- OHA license in AEMT, EMT-I, or Paramedic
- Certifications in ACLS, PALS, PHTLS, CCEMTP, CCP-C, FP-C, CP-C, or equivalents
- Five years of EMS field experience
- Associates Degree in Paramedicine or other related field
- NFPA Firefighter certifications
- Experience working within a fire department-based EMS system, public health, case management, community healthcare, or social services

EQUIPMENT

Operates office equipment, such as computers and software, calculator, copy machine, scanner, shredder, fax machine, and multi-line telephone. Must be able to operate all MIHC field equipment and capable of assisting with ambulance equipment.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Must be able to pass WLFEA single role physical agility course and sit and stand for extended periods of time.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

- Pass a criminal background and reference check
- Successful completion of a medical and physical screening
- Pass pre-employment drug screening
